## Stephen Lawrence Day

This year we marked the 30th anniversary of Stephen Lawrence's tragic murder, students worked in their Family Groups during their PSHE lesson to commemorate his life and legacy.

In honour of this significant day, our students engaged in a series of activities aimed at understanding the events surrounding Stephen's murder, the subsequent failures within the police and judicial systems, and the concept of institutional racism that his case exposed in the UK.

Through thought-provoking discussions and reflective exercises, our students delved into the details of what happened on the night of Stephen's murder and the profound impact it had on his family, community, and the nation as a whole. They grappled with the harsh realities of institutional racism and its pervasive presence in society, challenging us all to confront uncomfortable truths and work towards meaningful change.

It was heartening to witness our students' genuine interest and eagerness to learn more about the issue of institutionalised racism, particularly in light of recent events and discussions surrounding the racial disparities report commissioned by the Conservatives. Despite the report's controversial findings, our students demonstrated a keen awareness of the systemic barriers and inequalities still faced by ethnic minorities in the UK.

As a school community, we stand united in our commitment to honouring Stephen Lawrence's memory by actively challenging injustice, promoting empathy and understanding, and creating a culture of belonging where everyone feels valued and respected.
