Dear Parents and Carers,

We are delighted to welcome you and your children into St Mary Magdalene CofE Primary School! It is a pleasure to see the children settle smoothly into their reception classes, ready to embark on an exciting year of learning and growth. Mrs Bdeir is the class teacher in Makeba class, and Miss Kuijper is the class teacher in Hawkins class.

We start the new academic year in Reception by establishing positive relationships with the children and supporting them to develop their confidence and independence in the new setting. This is an opportunity to get to know the children and help them settle into the new routines and learn class and school rules and expectations. The children will have ample opportunities to play and explore, building friendships and bonding with staff members.

A very busy year is ahead of us and learning this year will be extremely varied to ensure effective engagement from the children as well as meeting their individual needs. Class teachers will carry out direct teaching on the carpet of phonics, maths, literacy, RE and other subjects. In addition, they will set up indoor and outdoor provisions with different activities to supplement children's learning through play and movement. When children start developing their reading and writing skills, one-to-one and group teaching will take place by class teachers and support staff to help consolidate the learning.

We'll start the first half of the Autumn term with our topic 'All About Me'. Through reading books, class discussions and activities children will be inspired to think about themselves and their uniqueness. By looking at their baby photos they'll talk about how they have changed and what qualities and skills they have developed. This will extend to other areas of learning, like art for example where they'll explore media to create self-portraits. In the second half of the term our topic will be 'Lights and Festivals', a very festive time of the year filled with special celebrations like Diwali and Christmas. We'll immerse the children in experiences to deepen their understanding of the differences between communities and their traditions.

Phonics is taught every day; children learn a new sound and practise saying and forming it. We encourage children to practise writing their names and the alphabets at home. This is to reinforce their letter formation and strengthen hand and finger muscles. Reading a focus book and engaging with it is vital to our literacy sessions. Children will develop vocabulary and sentence structure to re-tell stories, describe characters and invent their own simple stories. As they build their repertoire of sounds, children will start writing simple words and short phrases.

In Maths children will explore different things identifying qualities and sorting into groups. We will then spend a good time exploring numbers and counting. Children will learn about the composition of numbers and comparing quantities. This is along with developing their mathematical language and reasoning skills.

PE days are Wednesday (indoor) and Friday (outdoor) Children will need to come to school in their **PE kits on Monday (outdoor) and Wednesday (indoor).** Please ensure your child has appropriate kit for indoor and outdoor lessons and all items are labelled. PE kit is a white t- shirts, dark-coloured shorts / bottoms, black jumper or cardigan (no hoodies, skins or football shirts) and black trainers/plimsolls. Earrings should not be worn on these days and no other jewellery should be worn to school.
